- The E stands for ESTABLISH a routine. Establish routines and procedures for your children at home. Teachers will have rules and procedures for them to follow and so should you. This will help develop consistency inside the classroom and at home.
- The D stands for DEVELOP organization skills. This will help your children keep track of their materials. Check bookbags and notebooks often to see if they are organized.
- The **G** stands for **GUIDE** communication. Teach your children to effectively communicate with their teachers and their peers in a respectful manner.
 - The last **E** stands for **ENCOURAGE** independence. Encourage them to take responsibility for their own learning when it come to assignments, studying, taking test, and seeking help when needed.
