After the concert, I spoke with the coordinator for First Baptist about getting the choir to come and perform at Johns Chapel AME Church in 2000, when they return back to the states. The choir tours the United States every two years.

Due to the pandemic, the choir's last visit to the United States was 2019. They were performing at the time in Texas and were told they would be returning back to Uganda immediately. Therefore, their tour was closed. The tour is for six months.
