
THE COLORS OF WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH

VALERIE LYNN RUSSELL “CORPORATE CHRISTIAN 101”

Valerie Lynn Russell was born in 1972 in Enterprise, Alabama to parents Wayne and Annie Jean Russell-Elliard. At an early age Wayne taught her the importance of entrepreneurship and owning real estate.

A 1991 high school graduate of Enterprise High School, Valerie left her hometown to attend college at Alabama A&M University where she earned a B.S. degree in Communications with a concentration in Marketing. She pledged Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. while in undergrad. Although Valerie had been groomed for entrepreneurship, she found media exciting. In 1996 she launched her TV career as a morning show producer and reporter in Columbia, SC. She later got her real estate license to create a business part time. After three years in the business, she decided to get her Broker’s license and opened her own real estate firm, Crescent Real Estate.

During the peak of her real estate career, her life took an unexpected turn which created a temporary setback. She maintained her real estate brokers license but shut down her company and returned to corporate America at an NBC Affiliate in Columbia, SC. She was the first African American Woman to work as an Account Executive at this station. During her 15-year tenure at the television station, she earned awards, trips, and maximum income. She was awarded MVP of the Year. The first year of COVID was her most profitable year. She earned more income than her managers.

In September 2020 Valerie was approached by Gray Television Corporate to meet with the General Manager of WTVY in Dothan, Alabama. She was recruited to manage the sales team as the General Sales Manager. The possibility of returning home after 30 years felt surreal. Valerie prayed and knew God was calling her back home to the Wiregrass. After six interviews, Valerie was hired as the first African American General Sales Manager at the #1 Television station in the Wiregrass, WTVY. Today she manages a team of 9 employees. She is a Loaned Executive with the Wiregrass United Way and a member of Kappa Pi Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Inc. She still maintains her SC Brokers License and now Alabama Broker’s License. She is a graduate of National Association of Broadcasters Leadership Program and is currently in National Association of Black Journalist Leadership Program.

She recently authored her first book, *Corporate Christian 101* where she shares Christian principles on how to navigate through corporate America and not lose your core values. Within three days of launch, *Corporate Christian 101* became #1 on Amazon Hot New Releases in Christian Professional Growth.

February 2, 2023, Valerie was promoted to Vice President and General Manager of WTVY-TV. Valerie is the first Woman and African American Vice President and General Manager of the Wiregrass Leader. She credits her accomplishments to her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, her parents, and angels God has assigned to her life to coach her on her journey.
